## Dear Parishioners,

Last week's brunch following our Sunday Masses was a big success; a big thank you for all the volunteers who gave so much of their time making the food and beautifying the hall for the occasion. It is such a wonderful thing to see us all come together as a parish community.

This week our entire Christian family comes together as we individually and collectively walk with Jesus during his passion, death and resurrection. Holy Week is appropriately the holiest time of the year for us Christians. During this week, we accompany Jesus first to the upper room where on Holy Thursday he institutes the Eucharist and the priesthood. We then walk with Jesus on Good Friday as he is betrayed and made to carry his cross to Calvary, and are with his mother as he is crucified and dies. We then wait and pray on Holy Saturday in the great silence that covers the earth, for our savior is dead. Finally we experience the great light that shines forth from the tomb during the Easter Vigil, and rejoice with the whole Church on Easter Sunday, for our savior is risen. The liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday help us to enter into this holy time of year. Consider attending one or all of them; I promise you that you will not regret it.

Because Fr. Cortinovis, before he left, secured a priest to help me for Holy Week, there will be a full compliment of Holy Week liturgies here at Sacred Heart. Fr. Dennis McManus will arrive on Holy Thursday and assist me in making sure both Sacred Heart and Holy Angels are able to celebrate these liturgies. He is a priest of Mobile, Alabama but teaches at Georgetown University and is a consultant for the US Conference of Catholic Bishops in Washington. His expertise lies in two fields: the relationship of Jews with early Christians and second, the meaning of Judaism in Roman Catholic liturgy. Please join me in welcoming Fr. McManus to our parish!

Be assured of my prayers for all of you as we join with Jesus in his suffering and rise with him to new life on Easter Sunday.

**HOLY SATURDAY:** Because the Easter Vigil cannot begin before dark, the Easter Vigil and First Mass of Easter will be at 8:00 p.m.

**EASTER SUNDAY:** The Easter Mass schedule will be 6:30, 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.

**HOLY LAND COLLECTION:** For hundreds of years the Franciscan Fathers and Brothers have been the guardians of the Sacred Shrines associated with the birth, life, death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. They also care for the dwindling Catholic Palestinian population and the pilgrims who visit the Holy Shrines. More than ever, they need our help. The collection on Good Friday will be sent to help the people of the Holy Land.
