Dear Sacred Heart Family,

What a wonderful blessing God gave us in the visit of Pope Francis to Washington and the United States! His talks and homilies and actions were very moving. The complete texts of what he said can be found online on the USCCB website (www.usccb.org) or the Vatican website (www.vatican.va).

The pope also has given the Church another very important gift. He has announced that from December 8, 2015 (the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception) - November 30, 2016 (Solemnity of Christ the King), a special "Holy Year of Mercy" will take place. Pope Francis has expressed his wish that all of us can experience in this Holy Year God's mercy "which comes to meet each person in the Face of the Father who welcomes and forgives, forgetting completely the sin committed."

God's mercy also touches us in the many problems we encounter in our lives, in our marriages and in our families. These "knots" are often too much for us – we are powerless to undo them. But God has given us a Mother – Mary. When we bring her the knots of our lives, she unties them.

So to prepare for the start of this Holy Year of Mercy, we as a parish will ask the intercession of "Mary, Undoer of Knots" on the nine Sundays before December 8. We will recite the prayer on the next page every Sunday beginning next Sunday, October 11 until Sunday, December 6. It is my hope that by invoking our Mother's assistance, we as a parish may experience the Father's mercy during this upcoming Holy Year as the knots of our lives are undone by her powerful intercession.
