Dear Sacred Heart Family,

From the bottom of my heart, I want to thank you for your wonderful outpouring of support last weekend as I was ceremonially installed as pastor of Sacred Heart parish. What a beautiful celebration it was, and the reception the night before was just as wonderful! Thank you for your presence in such large numbers and to all those who worked so hard to make it a special occasion. But most of all, thank you for welcoming me into this community – I am truly blessed to be a part of this wonderful parish. What a fantastic first assignment as pastor, one I hope will last for many, many years!

This Sunday, something special is also happening - Mother Teresa is being canonized by the Church. Even while this humble woman was alive, people who met her just knew she was a saint. But now, after two miraculous healings that science cannot explain have been directly attributed to her intercession, she will officially be declared a Saint. Mother Teresa was born in Yugoslavia in 1910, lived in a relatively well-off family, and entered the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin at age 18. After completing the novitiate there, they sent her to Calcutta, India to teach geography and history in a high school for well off children. She did this for 15 years and enjoyed it immensely. Then when she was on a train going away for a retreat, she heard Jesus speak to her heart to serve him in the poorest of the poor. She readily accepted this call to leave everything comfortable behind, to leave her community even, and to love Jesus in the poor. The motto she was most fond of repeating was "I thirst". This was Jesus' cry from the cross, but Mother Teresa also heard Jesus saying this from the hearts of the poorest of the poor – Jesus thirsts in them for our love. And she founded the Missionaries of Charity to bring Jesus' love to those who are unloved.

This Sunday, we can say thank you also to God for raising up such a beautiful witness for us on how we can become saints – by loving the unloved. And to ask for Saint Teresa's intercession so we can experience how deeply Jesus loves us, and then to share that love with those most in need.
